

- Go along the straight lane that runs behind the Mill House. This lane was originally a "tub road" where coal and iron were brought to the Worsbrough spur of the Dearne & Dove Canal for transportation ignoring the wooden bridge on the right continue forward.
- Where two tracks form a crossroad turn right continue along this cart track through one of the best examples of Willow Carr in the North of England; crossing over Rockley Dike which feeds into Worsbrough reservoir.
- In approx 0.5 kilometre the cart track is dissected by a smaller footpath, turn right onto this footpath and continue forward following the contour of Worsbrough reservoir and keeping to the footpath, bear right over a flag stoned pack horse bridge that crosses Brough Green Brook. (if you are lucky you may see water voles near the waters edge feeding or preening themselves)
- After the bridge and in approx 30 metres the footpath turns sharp right; ignoring the track going up the banking. Continue forward, in approx 1 kilometre and after reaching the open water of Worsbrough reservoir, the track turns sharp right to continue along the edge of the reservoir.
- Ignoring the tarmac footpath across the top of the reservoir, continue forward and turn right down the hill with Worsbrough Mill and the Mill House visible in front and slightly to your right.
- At the base of the hill to your left can be seen dissecting the meadow a "Goyt" (stream) This was used to feed the Worsbrough Spur of the Dearne & Dove Canal and runs under the houses in the distance and also under the main A61 Sheffield road.
- Where the track bears left, turn right over the two stone bridges, just over the second bridge turn right, you are now back at Worsbrough Mill Museum.

FOLLOW THE COUNTRY CODE
