

- 1 Go along the straight lane that runs behind the Mill House. This lane was originally a "tub road" where coal and iron were brought to the Worsbrough spur of the Dearne & Dove Canal for transportation ignoring the wooden bridge on the right continue forward.
- 2 Where two tracks form a crossroad continue forward over a wooden stile and on to a wooded lane. On your left (25 metres) there is an opening into an old sandstone quarry.
- 3 Continuing forward the track forks right, ignoring the inclined plain to the left. (another segment of tramway bringing coal from bell pits higher up the hill, unfortunately now long gone due to agricultural activity)
- 4 In approx 25 metres sign post right over bridge, continue forward through a willow carr on your right and open fields on your left.
- 5 At sign post turn left onto cart track and continue uphill eventually seeing a small woodland on your right and a view over open fields to the roof tops of Rockley Old Hall. (a detour left along the cart track will reveal fine views of the hall; however please respect the privacy of the residence and keep to the footpath remembering to retrace your footsteps to continue the walk)
- 6 Where the cart track turns left go right keeping the woodland on the right.

- 7 Continue forward following the contour of the woodland reaching a metal swing gate, go through and over a ditch, turn left following the footpath bearing right over a flag stoned pack horse bridge that crosses Brough Green Brook. (if you are lucky you may see water voles near the waters edge feeding or preening themselves)
- 8 In approx 30 metres the footpath turns sharp right; ignoring the track going up the banking. In approx 1 kilometre and after reaching the open water of Worsbrough reservoir, the track turns sharp right to continue along the edge of the reservoir.
- 9 Ignoring the tarmac footpath across the top of the reservoir, continue forward and turn right down the hill with Worsbrough Mill and the Mill House visible in front.
- 10 At the base of the hill to your left can be seen dissecting the meadow a "Goyt" (stream). This was used to feed the Worsbrough Spur of the Dearne & Dove Canal and runs under the houses in the distance and also under the main A61 Sheffield road
- 11 Where the track bears left, turn right over the two stone bridges, just over the second bridge turn right, you are now back at Worsbrough Mill Museum.
