

The Chevin

The Chevin is a prominent natural feature rising steeply above the town of Otley.

The lower wooded area gives way to rocky outcrop and quarry face, culminating in upland heather slopes from where you can enjoy magnificent views of the surrounding countryside. The name 'Chevin' probably comes from the Celtic word 'Cefn' meaning ridge.

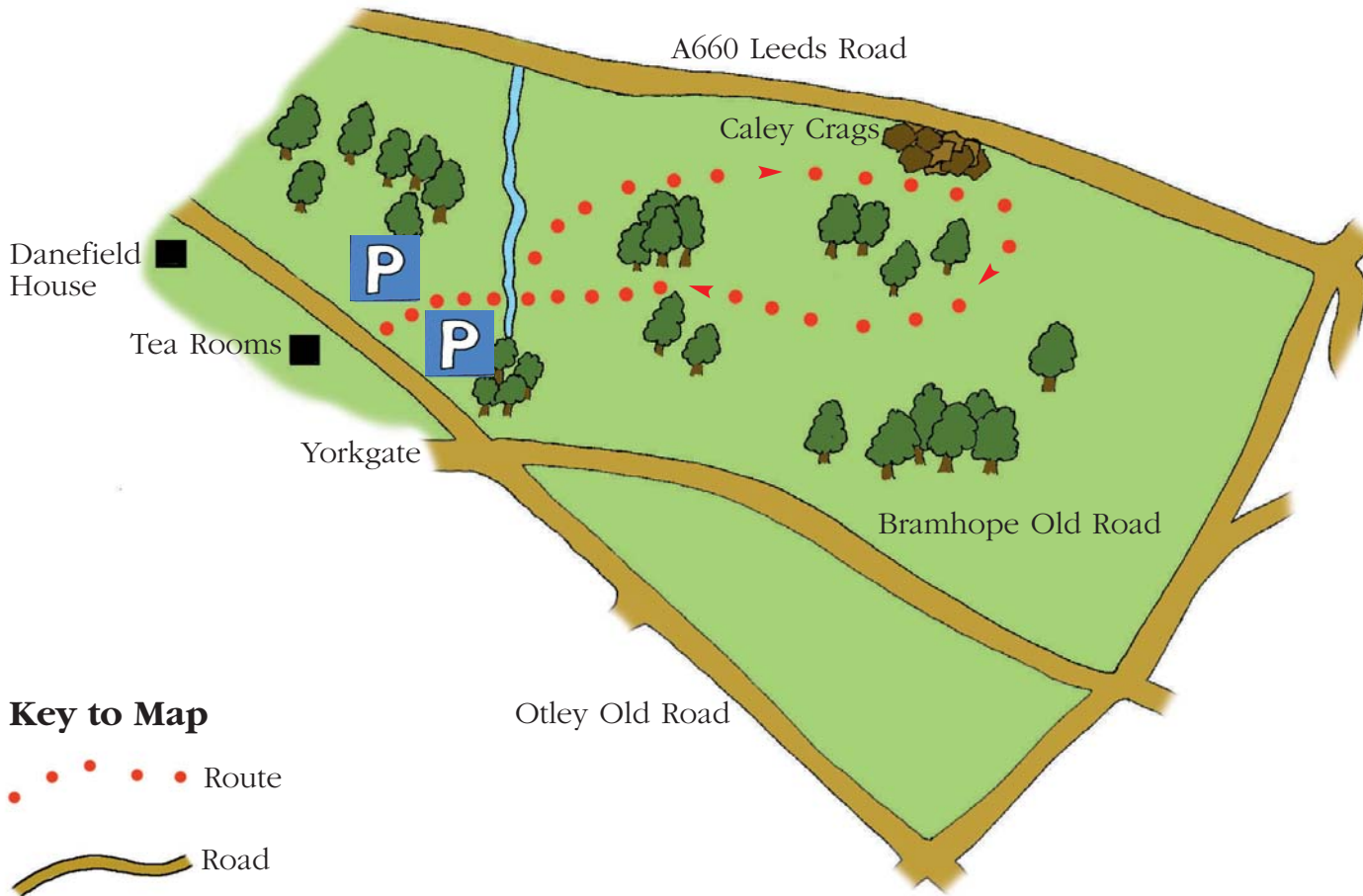
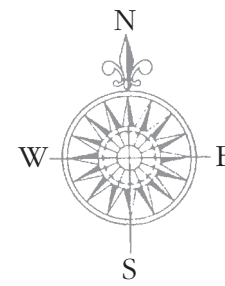


3 Otley Chevin: Caley Crags Circular

From the information board in the car park take the right fork and follow this until you cross a bridge. Turn left here and follow the path until you reach a right turn which follows down a steep slope to a kissing gate. Caley Crags are situated just through the kissing gate.

The path rises to a view point above the Crags giving a spectacular view of Otley. Turn right underneath the power lines and cross the moor to bring you to another kissing gate. Turn right here to bring you back to the car park.
