

## Kirkstall Abbey

Kirkstall Abbey was built over eight hundred years ago by the Cistercian Monks of Fountains Abbey. The site is one of Europe's finest examples of an early Cistercian Abbey complex and is of great historical landscape and architectural importance. The monks existed at Kirkstall from 1152 until 1539 when the dissolution of monasteries brought abbey life to an abrupt end.

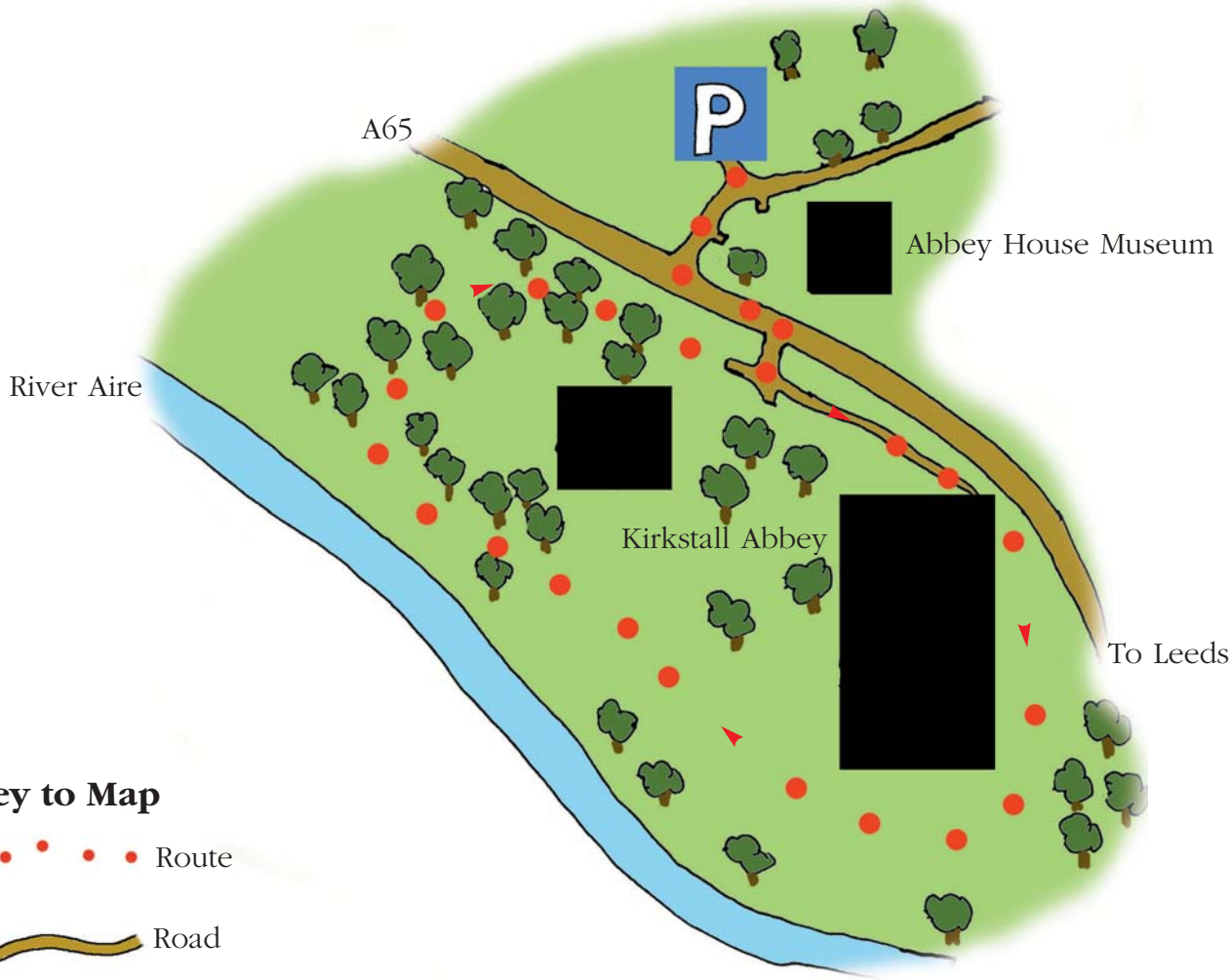
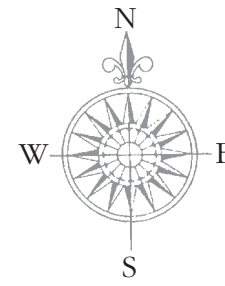

From the Abbey House Car Park cross the main road using the crossing and go through the gate into the Abbey grounds. Turn left here and follow the path round the Abbey remains. This path takes you in a loop around the Abbey and back to your starting point by the gate. The path is entirely tarmac and is suitable for both prams and wheelchairs.
